Neighborhood Security Cameras

Although neighborhood security does not fall within the jurisdiction of LHA, there is support for neighborhood security efforts, such as Safer Crocker <u>www.safercrockerhighlands.org</u>.

Another group of neighbors, led by Board member Miguel Drumond, decided to add a security camera system to their street, Alma Place. Nearly half of the homes on the street contributed to the camera system, making the per person cost very reasonable. Since its installation, the camera has captured numerous incidents with clearly identifiable information. Recent conversations with the Oakland Police Department have confirmed that the cameras are extremely effective, especially for solving more serious crimes.

Our beautiful, historic lampposts are only painted once every ten years. When tape is used to post a sign – painter's tape included – it removes paint and exposes the lamppost to the elements. To keep them rust free, both the LHA and the City of Oakland prohibit posting signs and notices on lamp posts and utility poles. Please do not post signs on our lampposts.
